7th International Symposium on Water Knowledge & Capacity Development organized by IHE-Delft, the Netherlands 4 July 2025 | Delft, Netherlands



Laurent-Charles Tremblay-Lévesque represented WEFE4MED at the Delft Symposium under UNESCO auspices, presenting a collaborative report titled "The Limits of Sponsored Transdisciplinary Communities of Practice." His session explored how nurturing versus pre-engineered approaches shape collaborative water governance, emphasizing lessons from co-designing knowledge-sharing networks. The discussion highlighted the balance between institutional support and organic community growth, underscoring WEFE4MED's contributions to advancing SDG 6 (Water for All).

FrontAg Nexus - Bodrum Municipality - Bahceyaka Seed Center Demonstrator



Ms. Sinem UAYAR KUYUMCU Manager Bahçeyaka Seed Center From seed to flourishing life, the Bahçeyaka Seed Center is where Bodrum's agricultural heritage is preserved and its future cultivated. Located in the Bahçeyakası neighborhood of Bodrum, Muğla, the Center spans more than 6,500m² and includes a greenhouse and 21 test gardens. It serves as a vital hub for conserving local and heirloom seeds, which is part of an effort crucial to protecting biodiversity and ensuring the survival of endangered varieties that enrich the region's ecosystem. Operated under the Bodrum Municipality Agricultural Services Directorate, the Center also supports local agriculture by distributing native seedlings, helping seed producers save up to 1.5 million TRY annually. "We're not just growing plants, we're growing resilience, knowledge, and community," says Ms. Sinem Uyar Kuyumcu, the Center's manager. Through ongoing propagation trials, the Center provides valuable data on yield, disease resistance, and climate adaptability, creating a strong link between research and the farming community.

The Bahceyaka Seed Center is affiliated to the FrontAg Nexus partner, Bodrum Municipality. It is a specialized facility focusing on the preservation, cultivation, and distribution of high-quality seeds to support sustainable agriculture. The Center plays a crucial role in promoting biodiversity by conserving local and traditional seed varieties while providing farmers with access to resilient, drought-tolerant, and productive seeds. The Center aims to enhance crop productivity, preserve traditional seeds to maintain biodiversity, and promote drought-tolerant seeds given increasing heat periods and water scarcity. This strategy enhances regional food security and contributes to environmentally sustainable farming practices.
