Green/Circular Economy and Artificial Intelligence: Levers for Women's **Entrepreneurship in the Mediterranean?** September 18-19, 2025, Tunis



The two-day workshop "Green / Circular Economy and Artificial Intelligence: Levers for Women's Entrepreneurship in the Mediterranean?" took place in Tunis on 19–18 September 2025, organized by FFEM, in collaboration with CAWTAR and IEMed. The event brought together experts and entrepreneurs to explore how green and circular economies, Al applications, and improved access to finance and markets can empower women in the Mediterranean. It featured inspiring success stories, interactive panels, and strategic discussions on sustainability and inclusive growth. Keynote speakers included Prof. Soukeina Bouraoui (FFEM & CAWTAR), Gemma Aubarell (IEMed), and Prof. Ali Rhouma (PRIMA), who presented "PRIMA WEFE Nexus: A new concept, a new approach?" Dr. Charles Kleinermann (ICARDA) spoke in concept, a new approach?" Dr. Charles Kleinermann (ICARDA) spoke in the session "Networks, Partnerships and Al Tools: Opportunities and Limits for Sustainability", emphasizing the value of R&D collaborations in advancing women's entrepreneurship through technology. WES-BCA Consultation Meeting on "Advancing WEFE Nexus policies, strategies and their implementation: a collaborative review of key findings and recommendations"



The online Consultation Meeting, held on September 2025,03, is part of the WES-BCA horizontal activity to assist in the advancement of policy and institutional settings for the WEFE Nexus at country level and contributes to the implementation of the draft WEFE Nexus Strategy in the Mediterranean Source to Sea Continuum

The draft Strategy represents the response to the challenges towards sustainable resource management in the Mediterranean, where water scarcity, rising energy demand, food insecurity, and environmental degradation create complex interdependencies that require coherent, integrated and cross-sectoral solutions. Its development is led by the Union for the Mediterranean, the Barcelona Convention and the European Commission, with technical support provided by the projects EU WES-BCA, GWP-Med, PRIMA WEFE4Med.

In this context, this first event was a focused consultation with the WES-BCA Focal Points for Water and Environment from Jordan, Lebanon, and Morocco in order to assess the state of WEFE Nexus integration in these countries, as significant steps on WEFE Nexus have been observed, and support cross-country learning on applied and anticipated solutions for advancing WEFE Nexus integration. Later in the year, a regional webinar will be organised by involving a wider group of stakeholders from across the Southern Mediterranean.

The Global Water Partnership-Mediterranean (GWP-Med) synergizes in this activity through the GEF UNEP/MAP MedProgramme Child Project 2.2. on 'Mediterranean Coastal Zones: Managing the WEFE Nexus' and the PRIMA WEFE4Med Project. For the WEFE4MED in particular, this synergy with WES BCA concerns the work on WEFE Nexus Governance that is one of WEFE4MED's four thematic focus areas. **Read More**
